A sia Pacific continues to develop at a swift pace despite economic unease within its two largest trade partners – the EU and the US. Shifting trade lanes, the growth of the ASEAN community and increasing intra-regional trade have prompted a transformation in the region's logistics market and significant investment by logistics providers.

As trade dynamics change with its largest trade partners, Asia Pacific is in search of new partners. Africa, for example, is among the fastest growing trade markets for China. It is anticipated that trade between Africa and China could surpass trade with Europe and the US in the next three to five years. In addition, intra-Asia trade is on the increase, a theme that will continue to develop as the creation of the ASEAN economic bloc is realised in 2016.
